The	Water Cycle

Did you know that the water that comes out of your sink has been around for millions of years? It's true! Water goes through a cycle that lets us reuse water over and over again even when it seems it has disappeared. Water falls from the sky as <a href="mailto:precipitation">precipitation</a>. There are four types of precipitation: rain, snow, sleet, and hail. Once precipitation lands on the ground, there are limitless things that could happen to the water. The water could flow down into a drain, form a puddle, run off into a pond, or simply land in your hair and get you wet! One thing is for sure, water always ends up back in the sky in the form of <a href="water vapor">water vapor</a>. The sun acts as a heater which causes the water to seem to disappear back into the sky as a gas that is called water vapor. This step of the water cycle is called <a href="evaporation">evaporation</a>. Did you know thousands of feet in the air it is actually extremely cold? This drop in temperature causes the water vapor to <a href="condense">condense</a> or clump together into clouds. Condensation begins this whole cycle all over again! Isn't the water cycle fascinating?

# Harriet Tubman

Harriet Tubman was an African-American woman who escaped from slavery in 1849. Even though she was free, she returned to Maryland to help her family escape. Tubman made dozens of trips to help rescue about seventy slaves. She never lost one person! Her nickname was Moses. She traveled secretly at night to free several enslaved people. Many other people who **opposed** slavery helped her. Opposed means to be against something. These people that helped her lived in homes that were called safe houses. This was all part of what was known as the Underground Railroad. The word "railroad" probably makes you think of trains, but there were no trains involved. Slave owners were so angry that Tubman was **outsmarting** them that they offered a huge reward to anyone that could capture her. No one ever could!
